## 'Sing Ye to the Lord a New Song'

Palm Sunday, April 17, will be a glorious celebration of the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. All of Shandon's children's choirs will open the 11 a.m.

### Worship

service as we wave palm branches while the choirs process.

The service will include J.S. Bach's most famous and certainly most stunning "Motet Singet dem Herrn, ein neues Lied," sung in an English translation "Sing Ye to the Lord a New Song." This amazing work is written for two choirs, so the Shandon Chancel Choir will split into two choirs accompanied by Bill McNair on the organ. Scholars believe the motet was written as a song of praise for a New Year's service celebrating the signing of the Dresden Peace Treaty in 1745.

The text, based on Psalms 149 and 150, is quite exuberant, filled with numerous joyous references: saints singing praise to God, Israel singing joyfully to God the creator, the sons of Zion joyfully extolling their King, dancing and singing, and everyone praising God in song.

The middle section is a dialogue between the choirs, one singing a chorale melody extolling the steadfast nature of God's love, the other singing petitions to God for protection and guidance. This is followed by a short movement of praise for the mighty acts of God, then moving to a glorious end where the choirs join together for "All that has life and breath, praise ye the Lord, Alleluia!"

What a wonderful way to draw attention to the amazing power of God given in Christ as we begin our journey with Him to the cross, the tomb and the resurrection. - Lillian Quackenbush

### Check your blood pressure

*Screening available monthly at Shandon*

The official launch of Blood Pressure Sunday will be held from 9-10:30 a.m. April 3 in the church parlor. Screening will be administered by a doctor or nurse from the Shandon congregation.

Blood Pressure Sunday will be offered the first Sunday of each month.



Hypertension can damage arteries or result in a heart attack, stroke or kidney disease, and it can complicate other health issues.

Unfortunately, "we usually don't know when we have it unless somebody tests us for

it," said Dr. Dale Hamrick, a member of the Older Adult Care Team.

High blood pressure "can be stopped, and usually easily and cheaply, before the damage is done," Dr. Hamrick said. Screenings take only about five 5 minutes or less.

Blood Pressure Sunday is sponsored by the Senior Adult Care Team but is open to all adults in Shandon's congregation. For questions, contact Lynn Roberts (781-5295).

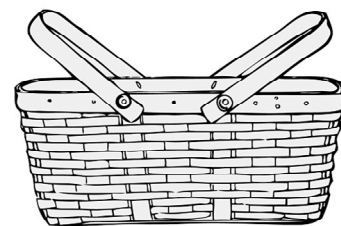

## 'To unite all things in Him, things in heaven and things on earth'

In the 1960s, Gaylord Nelson, a U.S. senator from Wisconsin concerned about environmental degradation called for an "environmental teach-in" where

Americans could learn the facts about what was happening around them. The teach-in was held April 22, 1970, in

colleges and cities around the United States, and more than a million people participated. Its effect was historic, leading to the establishment of the Environmental Protection Agency and to the passage of the Clean Air Act and Clean Water Act. The celebration of Earth Day has spread around the world, with 175 countries participating.

This year Earth Day falls on Good Friday. In our observance of Holy Week, we are called to be mindful of the promise of resurrection -- not only for ourselves, but as stewards of God's creation. The Presbyterian Church USA has committed to this calling through the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program,



which has a focus on reconciliation in all relationships, including our relationship to creation. In scripture "He has made known to us the mystery of His will, according to His good pleasure that He set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to unite all things in Him, things in heaven and things on earth." (Ephesians 1: 9-10)
