## 2011 Peacemaking Offering: Hope for the Homeless

This year the recipient of Shandon's portion of the Peacemaking Offering will be Transitions, a Midlands Housing Alliance center, to serve the homeless.

Located in downtown Columbia, the center's mission is to transition homeless people into permanent housing and self-sufficiency. The center has a structured program for building life skills, and it provides long-term living space for the homeless who volunteer to enter this program.

For any homeless person, the center maintains a large day space with shower and laundry facilities, provides some beds for overnight use and serves meals. Counseling and agency service providers are available on site as is short-term respite care.

The Peacemaking Offering will be received on Oct. 2, which is World Communion Sunday. Please give generously to support the extremely important work of the Transitions center.



## Contemplative worship begins Oct. 2

We are ready to begin our Sunday evening contemplative (Taize) worship services for this fall. The first service will be in the sanctuary at 5:30 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 2. Services will continue each Sunday evening until Dec. 18.

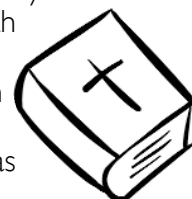
Based on the style of worship found in the Taize community in the Burgundy region of France, our service will start with prayer and meditation with selected passages from the first chapter of the Gospel of Mark. Extended periods of silence allow for individual prayer and meditation. Also, each Sunday evening we will gather around the table for the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. As in past years, the music will be primarily simple, chant-like songs from the Taize community in France.

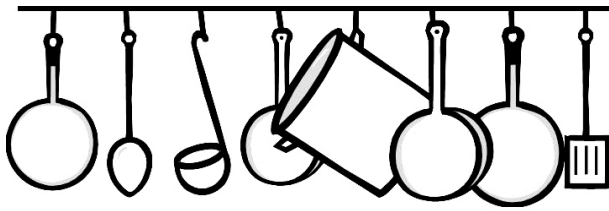

## Shandon volunteers deliver Meals on Wheels

More than 60 Shandon volunteers deliver Meals on Wheels to homebound members of our community.

Fifty-eight volunteers participate one day each month, and seven (Julie Kinion and Pat Wolthoff, Allan Schurr, Kay and Guy White and Sara and Reggie Freeman) deliver meals two days a month. Five people are substitutes who, in addition to carrying a regular route, are called upon in an emergency. Shandon's routes serve about 12 people. In the past, that number has been up to double this amount.



Shandon's Meals on Wheels outreach began in approximately 1992 after Dave Smith, a former member of Trinity Presbyterian Church, spoke at a Wednesday night supper telling about Trinity's involvement with the program.

Shandon's pastor at that time, Lewis Galloway, asked for a show of hands as to who would be interested in participating. The large response allowed Shandon to sponsor two routes. Dave Smith was the coordinator for the first few years with Zelle Burnside's assistance. When Dave moved, Zelle took over as coordinator until October 1996 when Sara Freeman became coordinator.

Meals on Wheels provides a daily nutritious meal as well as personal contact to homebound persons, regardless of age or income. Individuals may apply themselves or be referred by a hospital, doctor, family member, etc. However, no one is denied based on income.

Senior Resources is in charge of the local program. Volunteers have numerous ways in which they can help. They can assist in packing the meals from 9-10:30 a.m. at the delivery site. Sara Freeman will be glad to add your name to a list of people to fill vacancies on a route as they occur. Monetary donations are welcome: \$105 will prepare and deliver a meal for one person for a month; \$25 will provide meals for a week; and \$5 will provide for one meal.

More than 400 local volunteers weekly provide this service for the more fragile members of our city. Shandon's congregation has faithfully participated in this effort to assist our neighbors in need.



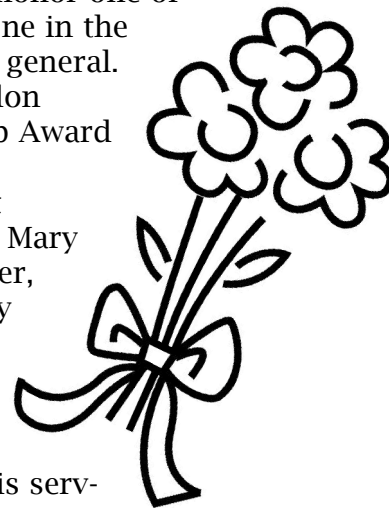
## Mary Fant receives annual award presented by Presbyterian Women

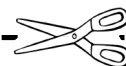

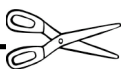

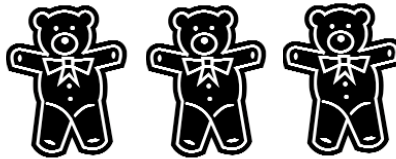
